


COOK COUNTY WHEEL TAX RELIEF



With residents facing so many challenges and difficulties created by the coronavirus, Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle and the Department of Revenue are working tirelessly to provide meaningful relief throughout Cook County. These changes to the Wheel Tax will **help reduce fines, provide much-needed financial breathing room for vehicle owners and extend deadlines for payment because it is the right thing to do** during these trying times. These important ordinance updates have the potential to impact nearly 80,000 vehicles in Cook County.

- ✓ The new ordinance **extends the current wheel tax license year by two months to August 31, 2020**, providing extra time and flexibility to vehicle owners.
- ✓ Vehicle owners will have a **new 30-day grace period where late fees will be reduced significantly**. This represents about 70% savings for most owners.
- ✓ The updated ordinance **streamlines and clarifies the tax application** by removing residency language to ensure taxation is based on vehicle registration address.


At least 70% decrease in late fees for most registered vehicles in unincorporated Cook.
